 We will remember them.*

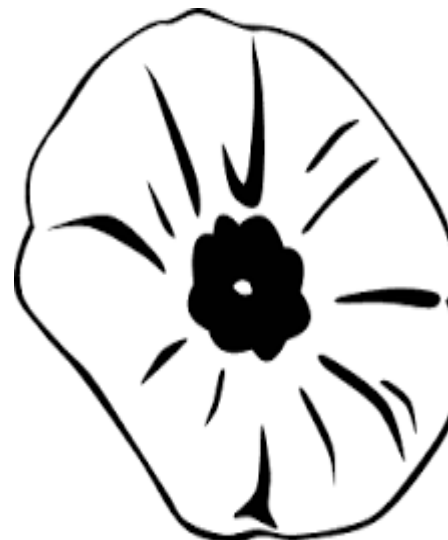
