

THE SUNDAY READINGS offer much enlightenment as ever:

The first reading (Ezekiel) dwells on the tricky subject of calling someone to order after reprehensible behaviour, but says it is necessary for our salvation.

The second reading (Rom 13): we continue our journey through St Pauls's letter to the Romans. He reminds us of the need to love our neighbour.

The gospel (St Matthew): the power of praying together is accentuated, as is the need to forgive our brethren who offend us.

WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR THE CARE OF CREATION

We continue this brief season through to the feast of St Francis in early October.

SAINTS ALIVE amongst those honoured this coming week:

- * The Birthday of Our Blessed Lady on Tuesday. We have a lovely stained glass window in St Charles of Mary as a young girls with Anne her mother. Worth more than a glance.
- * St Peter Claver A Jesuit missioner from Catalonia on Wednesday He arrived in Cartagena, in what is now Colombia, in 1610, and after his ordination six years later he became 'the slave of the Negroes forever', labouring on their behalf for 33 years, attending to both their spiritual and material needs. The slave trade was repeatedly condemned by the Popes; but it was too profitable to be stopped and on the whole the local church hierarchy kept quiet about it, much as they did in North America in the 19th century. He brought fresh food to the slave-ships as they arrived, instructed the slaves and baptized them in the faith, followed their progress and kept track of them even when they were sent to the mines and plantations, defending them as well as he could from oppressive slave-owners. He organized teams of catechists who spoke the many languages spoken by the slaves. He worked in hospitals also, looking after lepers among others, and in prisons. Sadly he was ostracised for this heroism, and died a sad an lonely death. A blessed patron in these BAME days.

HELPING OUR STEWARDS Our gratitude to our diligent stewards knows no bounds. No stewards - no Mass! Their duties continue long after every congregant has gone home, in the cleaning and sanitising of the church, especially in those places where parishioners have sat or touched. Hadfield stewards have asked that

- Each parishioner arriving for Sunday Mass is offered a small plastic bag, containing an antiseptic wipe;
- At the end of Mass the parishioner cleanses that part of seat and bench-rail & returns the used wipe to the bag,
- And takes the bag to the bin by the church door.
