

#### PARISH NOTES

THIS WEEKEND we celebrate World Mission Sunday:

World Mission Sunday is vital to the growth of the Church and the spread of the Gospel in predominately impoverished and remote areas overseas. The funds raised build much-needed infrastructure, from chapels and schools to orphanages, clinics and dispensaries. Requested by the local community, the support from Missio transforms lives and creates a hub from which the young Church can flourish and grow. World Mission Sunday is one of only three Papal collections and has been especially chosen by the Holy Father to support the mission of the Church in the world. There is a second basket at the back of church for your collection/donation. Even in these difficult days, please be generous to Missio.

THE SUNDAY READINGS offer much enlightenment as ever;

In the first reading Isaiah insists that though "you do not know God", God comes to your assistance; In the second reading St Paul reminds his converts that they have been chosen, and that the Spirit of God empowers them:

The Gospel speaks of the duty to the civil authority, but more importantly to God's will.

#### **SAINTS ALIVE**

This Sunday overshadows the feastday of St Luke, evangelist. Even though St Luke is not in the forefront allows us to hope that we may have a "St Luke's Little Summer" - though more in hope than in expectation.

St John Paul II comes in to liturgical view later in the week. The memory of many may stretch back to May 1982 and his appearance at Heaton Park. My encounter with this saint was in Coventry when he came into the airport for public Mass.

St John Capestrano features also. He is one of the saints honoured as patron of military chaplains. Cheerful memories of Fr Daren who was curate hereabouts in 2003-5, and is now army chaplain in N Ireland.

**OCTOBER DEVOTIONS** October is the month of the holy rosary. Where possible, the rosary will be prayed 20 minutes before each public parish Mass.

CANON MICHAEL MOORE, the erstwhile parish priest of St Margaret's & Immaculate Conception, has been hospitalised in Nottingham after sustaining a fall at home. Multiple bruises and a some fractures mean that he will be out of action for some time. The Bishop invites us to pray for him.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNIONS at St Charles, which were scheduled for June earlier this year were amongst the early casualties of COVID lock-down. However it is hoped that most

of the candidates who were prepared for that great event will come on quiet Saturday morning Masses to receive Our Lord in Holy Communion for the first time. This staggered celebration is planned for the last three Saturdays in November, please God.
