Dear brethren in Christ Jesus,

What a year it's been as we've tried to adjust, as best we can, to the enforcement of the COVID-19 guidelines. This meant for a time the closure of our churches and huge restrictions on so many aspects of our ministry. But it also saw a huge output of creativity, on the part of both clergy and laity, with online streaming of Masses, opportunities for parishioners to 'join in' the Mass by means of their phone, and many other pastoral initiatives to keep people connected in parishes and chaplaincies. When our churches were allowed to be open again, for private and later for communal worship, the hygiene, stewarding and social distancing guidelines had first to be negotiated. I take

this opportunity to thank all who cooperated, in the generous collaborative work that ensured so many of our churches were able to reopen safely. My point is that, while it's certainly been a difficult year for the diocese, there's also much to celebrate and give thanks to God for as we journey through the season of Christmas.

The message of Christmas is, in a sense, an unspoken one. In the infancy narrative, as described by Luke, there is an atmosphere of silence. There's certainly much movement, but few words! The child in the manger cannot speak. Of Joseph, described by St Francis in 'Patris Corde' as a tender, loving, obedient, accepting, creatively courageous and working Father, no word is recorded. Mary, the mother of Jesus, also says little, but ponders all these things 'in her heart' (Lk 2:19). It can be said that the events of Christmas speak for themselves; that they are indeed more eloquent than any amount of words. They speak to us of the immensity of God's love which, as St Paul reminds us in the 2nd Reading of the Dawn Christmas Mass, we have done nothing to merit: "When the kindness and love of God our Saviour for mankind were revealed, it was not because he was concerned with any righteous actions we might have done ourselves; it was for no reason except his own compassion that he saved us" (Titus 3:4-5). We know God speaks to us at all times but, especially at Christmas, he speaks to us through his beloved Son, the Word made flesh, in whom he is well pleased. In the midst of all our preparations for Christmas, let's each accept the invitation to a little more attentive listening than usual; to create within ourselves a zone of inner silence where that 'still small voice' of God can be heard.

This Christmas, I wish each of you all the Blessings of the Christ-child, our Lord and Saviour, the one whom we strive to serve each day.

## YEAR OF ST JOSEPH

### Bishop Patrick refers to St Joseph. Here is the context:

In a new Apostolic Letter entitled <u>*Patris corde*</u> ("With a Father's Heart"), Pope Francis describes Saint Joseph as a beloved father, a tender and loving father, an obedient father, an accepting father; a father who is creatively courageous, a working father, a father in the shadows.

The Letter marks the 150th anniversary of Blessed Pope Pius IX's declaration of St Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church. To celebrate the anniversary, Pope Francis has proclaimed a special "Year of St Joseph," beginning on the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception 2020 and extending to the same feast in 2021.

At the conclusion of his Letter, he adds another prayer to St Joseph, which he encourages all of us to pray together:

Hail, Guardian of the Redeemer, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary. To you God entrusted his only Son; in you Mary placed her trust; with you Christ became man.

Blessed Joseph, to us too, show yourself a father and guide us in the path of life. Obtain for us grace, mercy, and courage, and defend us from every evil. Amen.
