

PARISH NOTES

THIS WEEKEND we come to the fifth Sunday in Lent. This is known as Passion Sunday, marking the start of the season-within-a season of Passiontide. The focus in the prayer-life of the church is on the sufferings of our Saviour, as we follow his footsteps towards Jerusalem and his final week on earth. **THE SOLEMNITY OF THE ANNUNCIATION** is celebrated on Thursday, when we commemorate the Angel Gabriel's visit to announce to Mary that she was to the Mother of God. This date of often referred to as Lady Day.

In England, Lady Day was New Year's Day (i.e. the new year began on 25 March) from 1155 until 1752, when the Gregorian calendar was adopted in Great Britain and its Empire and with it the first of January as the official start of the year in England, Wales and Ireland. A vestige of this remains in the United Kingdom's tax year, which ends on 5 April, or "Old Lady Day", i.e., Lady Day adjusted for the 11 "lost days" of the calendar change. Until this change Lady Day had been used as the start of the legal year but also the end of the fiscal and tax year.

DAY OF PRAYERFUL REFLECTION Next Tuesday, 23rd, marks the first anniversary of Lockdown1, the most severe of the COVID lockdowns. Our Government invites us to spend time reflecting, with a minute's silence at midday and doorstep vigils of light at 8pm. Our Bishops invite

us to spend time also in prayer: "May Tuesday 23rd March be a great day of prayer that this pandemic comes to an end and that the gift of God's Holy Spirit will carry us all forward to a new and better life, both here and in the world to come."

GOOD FRIDAY 2nd April Afternoon liturgy of the Passion of the Lord : 3pm both churches;HOLY SATURDAY 3rd April7.30pm (HAD)Easter Vigil & first Mass of EasterEASTER SUNDAY 4th Aprilusual Mass-times.
