

#### **PARISH NOTES**

THIS SUNDAY is known as 'Good Shepherd' Sunday. The gospel reading tells us of the gentle guardianship of Christ for his flock. That pastoral guardianship he entrusted to those who serve in ordained or consecrated ministry in the church. It is a time for us to give thanks so those holy priests and dedicated deacons who along with the religious sisters & brothers have helped us in the ways of faith and love for our church and its Lord. At the time when vocations to ordained ministry are few and far between in our country, we are encouraged to pray also for a renewal of family faith which is the wellspring of vocations to the priesthood and religious life. There is a second collection today to support the funding all those training for ministry as priests in our diocese.

LATER THIS WEEK we honour Our Lady of Fatima. Many will be familiar with the prayer recited at the end of each mystery of the rosary "Sweet Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from the fires of hell; lead all souls to heaven especially those who are in most need of your mercy." That prayer was dictated to the children by Our Blessed Lady during the Fatima apparitions, asking that it be recited during the rosary. FAITH AFFIRMING. A welcome this weekend to those families presenting their First Holy Communion children for the St Charles Mass of affirmation, as they journey towards the big day in June. It was good during the week in the church's lectionary to read Our Blessed Lord's words proclaiming that he was the 'bread come down from heaven'. 'Unless you eat my body and drink my blood you will not have life in you'. We pray for that new life of grace in this year's first Holy Communion candidates.

BISHOP PATRICK in a recent message to all parishes, has asked us to call general meetings of parishioners to look into the future of our parishes' administration. The proposals for parishes-amalgamation mooted a few years ago are now at the top of the agenda. The vicar general is due to visit the area soon to progress this process. It would be helpful to formulate some notes ahead of that meeting. Please come from both parishes at 5.30 next Sunday 15<sup>th</sup> to St Charles for an hour's meeting to think through these proposals. All welcome! If you are unable to attend, but have a point of view, make sure I get it to me in writing (or email) ahead of the meeting.

MAY DEVOTION we find ourselves in the delightful month of May, when our Almighty creator bedecks our woods and gardens with May loveliness. It is fitting that during this month we pay special regard to Our Lady. Today (8<sup>th</sup>) at Immaculate Conception we will honour the patroness of our church with a crowning moment. We hope for a similar May procession and crowning of Our Blessed lady on the 22nd at Saint Charles.

THE HOLY ROSARY is recommended most particularly during the month of May. This truly Catholic devotion, so much favoured by the Reformation martyrs of our country, is at the heart of Catholic prayer life especially this month. Where possible the rosary is prayed before every public Mass. I hope that you will find chance, whether privately or publicly, to honour Our Blessed lady in this wonderful way. **REACH FOR THE SKIES.** Worshippers at Immaculate Conception will notice the construction of scaffolding along the side of the church. Six months ago, there was a small falling of plaster within the church from the roof apex in the church. Investigation showed that the ridge tiles atop the church were separating and deteriorating – not too surprising after 125 years! This allowed water penetration, This clearly damaged (mercifully only a small section) of plaster. Work is underway to replace the ridge tiles and to make the top of the roof once again waterproof. As you may imagine the cost of scaffolding is three times the amount of the actual work atop the roof. Please be cautious as you manoeuvre around the church. **MOOR** AND **MOOR** It was good to spend recent time near a hamlet called Danby in the N Yorks moors. Having had the virtue of patience tested to the limit on Mottram Moor, it was a delight to sing God's praises for a more tranquil moor. Congestion there was however—of lambs and their mothers inviting us to be patient as they claimed the moorland roads. And the railway line! The Esk Valley train line runs through the most delightful scenery between Middlesborough and Whitby. Deer aplenty, - and errant sheep briefly bringing the train to a patient standstill. Bewitching to watch parent ployers guarding their chicks against raiding corvids, angrily flying up to defeat the would-be predators. And every day the haunting sound of the cuckoo moving along the valley below. Good also to climb the 199 (or CXCIX steps as highlighted in ancient brass markers) on the steep ascent to Whitby Abbey and the aura of St Hilda. Interesting notice on the door of the adjacent St Mary's church "Dracula is not buried in this churchyard". His Gothic followers were abundant on the busy streets among the fish & chip shops down helow.

GLOSSOP CHURCHES MISSION The two Redemptorist priests are coming to Glossop next weekend for a week's mission centred on the Glossop Catholic parishes. Full details are found in literature at the back of the church. I do hope that those looking for time of spiritual refreshment and encouragement will find their way to the advertised venues and events.
