PARISH NOTES

ALLELUIA! HE IS RISEN AND IS WITH US STILL!

THIS SUNDAY we come the end of the Easter Octave. We keep company with the apostles as Jesus comes among them again. 'Doubting Thomas' becomes 'believing Thomas', and teaches us the value of faith in the risen Lord.

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY the second Sunday Easter falls nine novena days after Good Friday. The late Holy Father St. John Paul II declared this Sunday to be 'Divine Mercy Sunday'. This is in response to our Lord's apparitions to St Faustina Kowalska in Poland during the middle of the 20th century. Many people support this devotion and pray the three o'clock prayer regularly. You can find that prayer and other connected devotions on many websites and learn much more about this devotion.

Pope Saint John Paul II offers an extended meditation on the mystery of God's mercy, which he calls "the greatest of the attributes and perfections of God" (Dives in misericordia, 13). He returned to this theme throughout his pontificate: 'As a gift to humanity, which sometimes seems bewildered and overwhelmed by the power of evil, selfishness, and fear, the Risen Lord offers His love that pardons, reconciles, and reopens hearts to love. It is a love that converts hearts and gives peace. How much the world needs to understand and accept Divine Mercy!

Lord, who reveals the Father's love by Your death and Resurrection, we believe in You and confidently repeat to You today: Jesus, I trust in You, have mercy upon us and upon the whole world.'

IN THE GOSPEL This passage from John's Gospel has all the more significance because it brings the Gospel to a close. The story of the breakfast-party with the Risen Christ on the

shore of the Lake of Galilee is a sort of appendix. The story-line of the main Gospel ends with Thomas blurting out 'My Lord and my God'. The Gospel therefore ends, as it began with the only two unmistakable declarations in the New Testament of the divinity of Jesus. 'The Word was God' and 'My Lord and my God' bracket the Gospel, showing the purpose and angle of the whole, to show that Jesus is God. It complements the other Gospels: they show a man who is also God, whereas this Gospel shows a God who is also man. It is with the divine authority that Jesus confers on his Church the divine power to forgive. Real forgiveness is indeed Godlike. It is not simply 'forgive-and-forget', but forgiveness in the knowledge that a hurt has occurred. Just as a bone, broken and merged together again, can be stronger than it was before it was broken, so forgiveness can create a real link of love on both sides, a treasured secret of divine graciousness between forgiver and forgiven.

THE SOLEMNITY OF THE ANNUNCIATION, which is ordinarily celebrated on 25th March, Lady Day, fell this year during Holy Week. Its liturgical celebration is transferred to the first date after the Easter Octave—this Monday.

LOOKING AHEAD Next Sunday 14th April I plan to be away on a short Easter break. I have asked 'the good Monsignor' Jonathan Moore to offer Sunday Mass. He has kindly agreed to offer the 11am Mass at St Charles next Sunday.

There will be no Mass at Immaculate Conception next Sunday. Details of weekend Masses in our area: Saturday evening, All Saints Glossop 6pm; Marple Bridge 6.30pm. On Sunday, New Mills & St Mary's Glossop 9.30; Marple Bridge, noon. And of course, 11am at St Charles. DEACON OWEN has kindly agreed to come to St Charles at 10am to lead a short liturgy of prayer and Holy Communion: Tuesday 9th to Friday 12th inclusive.

GOOD SHEPHERD SUNDAY is honoured on Sun 21st April. This is the day of prayer for more vocations to ordained ministry in the church. There will be a second collection for the clergy training fund that day.
