PARISH NOTES

THIS SUNDAY journey further into ordinary time, and wonder with the disciples where Jesus got his mighty power from?

THE GOSPEL Jesus certainly seems to have chosen a pretty dim and unappreciative group of disciples. They do call him 'Master', but after all these wonders they still don't really trust him, and have no hesitation about addressing him rudely and brusquely. Did you say, 'Just like me'? Well, perhaps I am just as untrusting. We often behave as though Jesus were quietly snoozing, quite unconcerned about our troubles and concerns, as we struggle hopelessly, up to our necks in the mud and sinking rapidly. However, once Jesus' attention has been roused, once they have put their trust in him, he effortlessly remedies the situation. There is surely an echo of the prophet Jonah, who was sleeping through the storm and was awakened by the sailors to provide a solution.

SAINTS ALIVE St John the Baptist has two feasts to himself. One, in August, celebrates his death, and one, in June, celebrates his birth. And this is as it should be, for as Christ himself said, John was the greatest of the sons of men. The greatest, but also the most tragic. A prophet from before his birth, leaping in the womb to announce the coming of the incarnate God, his task was to proclaim the fulfilment of all prophecies – and thus his own obsolescence. And he did it: with unequalled courage he spread the news that he, the greatest of all men, was the least in the kingdom of heaven. His disciples, and the devil, would have preferred him to fight, to build his sect, to defeat this upstart whom he himself had baptized, to seize his place in history. But he did not – and so, rightly, he has his place, and he has glory in heaven. St Irenaeus (130 - 202) was born in Smyrna, in Asia Minor (now Izmir in Turkey) and emigrated to Lyons, in France, where he eventually became the bishop. It is not known for certain whether he was martyred or died a natural death. He played a decisive role in fixing the canon of the New Testament. It is easy for people nowadays to think of Scripture – and the New Testament in particular – as the basis of the Church, but harder to remember that it was the Church itself that had to agree, early on, about what was scriptural and what was not.

THE NEW LECTIONARY The Scripture readings we hear at the celebration of Holy Mass and the Sacraments will soon sound different. The Lectionary, the set of books that contain the readings, is changing as part of the continuing process of revising the liturgical translations. The use of the new Lectionary will be mandatory from 1st December this year. The new translation will use the English Standard Version – Catholic Edition of the Bible and the Abbey Psalter. The change is intended to make the biblical translations more faithful to the original languages, in keeping with the best biblical scholarship, and to provide a text that is more 'proclaimable' and, where appropriate, more inclusive. Each parish needs to send in their prepaid order for the Lectionary by 30th June, and this will involve a considerable outlay for every Catholic church in the country. Members of Catholic congregations are being invited to make a donation towards the purchase of the new Lectionaries for their church. Some people might like to make a donation, perhaps in memory of a loved one, to completely cover the cost of one set of the books we will need in our parishes. There is a provision for a bookplate to be added to a book as a lasting memorial of the name of a person in whose name the book was donated. Other people may wish to contribute a smaller sum to be pooled with other donations.

£148 will cover one of the four books (Lectern-sized) needed in each church. £84 will cover one of the four books needed for use in the Oratory, and smaller places of worship. The Book of the Gospels costs £234. Donations by cheque ("St Charles church" or "St Margaret's church") or cash can be put in an envelope marked "New Lectionary" which can be put in the collection at Holy Mass. If you wish to remain anonymous, please put your contact details in with your donation. For donation by bank transfer, please note parish bank account details below. If you choose to donate enough to cover a complete book, you may wish to include a note for the bookplate (for example, "In loving memory of [name]" or "Presented by the [name] family". Thank you!
