PARISH NOTES

THIS SUNDAY is also dedicated as "Evangelii Gaudium" Sunday. A few years ago, the Bishops of England and Wales gave Home Mission Sunday a new title, 'Evangelii Gaudium' Sunday. This was to reflect the changing focus of evangelisation presented by Pope Francis in the Apostolic Exhortation of the same name. The threshold of a Jubilee year seems to me to be a good time to remind ourselves of what Pope Francis wrote about in 2023 about Evangelii Gaudium – themes which still resonate in the life of the Church and still have their influence on our current synodal process. I feel sure that as we deepen our appreciation of Evangelii Gaudium we can find a good way of entering our Jubilee Year 2025 as "Pilgrims of Hope." At the very beginning of the letter Pope Francis sets out the trajectory when he states that 'the joy of the Gospel fills the hearts and lives of all who encounter Jesus. Those who accept his offer of salvation are set free from sin, sorrow, inner emptiness and loneliness.' He goes on to say that in this exhortation he hopes to 'encourage the Christian faithful to embark upon a new chapter of evangelisation marked by this joy, while pointing out the new paths for the Church's journey in years to come.'

THE GOSPEL This is the turning-point of Mark's gospel: Peter comes to the realisation that Jesus is the Messiah, the Anointed of God, for whom everyone was waiting. However, Peter still does not understand what this implies. Jesus begins to show his disciples that the road to fulfilment is through suffering. Three times Jesus repeats this prophecy, and three times the disciples fail to grasp the lesson. Nor are we, later followers of Jesus, any quicker that the first disciples to learn this lesson. We greet with indignation and resistance any suffering that comes our way.

SAINTS ALIVE St Pio of Pietrelcina (1887-1968) was born in southern Italy, and joined the Capuchin friars at the age of 16. He became a priest seven years later and spent fifty years at the monastery of San Giovanni Rotondo, where he was very much sought after as a spiritual advisor, confessor, and intercessor. Many miracles were popularly ascribed to him during his lifetime. He died a few days after the fiftieth anniversary of his receiving the stigmata, and over 100,000 people attended his funeral. Our Lady of Walsingham The shrine of Our Lady at Walsingham in Norfolk was one of the great pilgrimage centres of mediaeval times. The lady of the manor of Walsingham, Richeldis de Faverches, had a vision in which the Virgin Mary instructed her to build in her village an exact replica of the house in Nazareth where the Annunciation had taken place. The original shrine was destroyed at the Reformation, but in the 19th and 20th centuries, pilgrimage to Walsingham was revived not only for Catholics but also for Anglicans. St Vincent de Paul (1581 – 1660) was born in Aquitaine and

became a priest. He devoted his whole life to the service of the poor. He founded a congregation of priests for missionary work, groups of laymen to help paupers and galley-slaves, and, with St Louise de Marillac, the Sisters of Charity. St Jerome (340 - 420) was born in Dalmatia. He studied in Rome, then went to Bethlehem, where he founded a monastery, a hospice, and a school, and settled down to the most important work of his life, the translation of the Bible into Latin, a translation which, with some revisions, is still in use today. He died at Bethlehem. St Thérèse of the Child Jesus (1873 - 1897) was born in Alençon, in France, on 2 January 1873. Her mother died when Thérèse was four, and the family moved to Lisieux. Thérèse became a nun at the Carmelite convent there at the age of 15, after a long battle against the superior, who insisted that 16, or even 21, would be a more sensible age. She died of tuberculosis at the age of 24. She was canonized in 1925, the Pope having suspended the rule that forbids canonization less than 50 years after someone's death.
