### *PARISH NOTES*

THIS SUNDAY is the last in October. We are edging towards the year-end at hurtling speed. As we switch to GMT we may ponder the meaning of time. - and get lost in the vastness of the universe in so doing. God gives us time to discover his face, to worship him and accept his law - whether in BST or GMT! We have an extra hour of discovery this Sunday.

PASTORAL LETTER Bishop has sent a pastoral letter to be read throughout the diocese today, addressing the assisted suicide bill. I'm sure than many of you, like me, messaged your MP with your objection to this proposal. You have an extra hour to do it today! THE GOSPEL Jericho is the last village on the way to Jerusalem, and the excitement of the great revelation of Jesus at the Passion is already upon them. The cured beggar dances on the way with them. He is the only person in Mark to call Jesus 'Son of David', drawing attention to Jesus' messianic ancestry, ready for his messianic entry into Jerusalem. Thirdly, in Mark Jesus says 'Your faith has cured you' only twice. The first time was to the woman with a haemorrhage, who had shown her faith with great courage by daring to touch Jesus garment in the crowd. Now Bartimaeus shows the same stubborn courage in carrying on shouting despite the attempts to silence him. So they both show with courage that they really do put their trust in Jesus and are confident that he will help. If our faith is to save us, it needs to be real, courageous and stubborn. Lukewarm, tentative faith is not enough. MAY HE REST IN PEACE I was sad to hear of the death of neighbouring priest and friend Fr Denis Maher. He died in hospital on 17th Oct. He had lived in retirement in the presbytery of his last parish, St Paul's, Newton (Hyde). A frequent visitor to our churches for talks and meditations, he was hugely respected & loved. He deserves his eternal rest. SAINTS ALIVE St Simon, is eleventh in the list of the twelve Apostles. He is known as Simon the Zealot, but nothing else is known about him. His other name of "Simon Cananaeus" simply adapts another Hebrew word for "zeal" and has nothing to do with the town of Cana. St Jude, Apostle also called Thaddaeus, is the one who at the Last Supper asked the Lord why he showed himself only to the disciples and not to the world. For many centuries he was scarcely venerated because people confused him with Judas Iscariot. He is the patron saint of lost and desperate causes.

**NEXT FRIDAY** is the 1st of November, the feast of All Hallows or All Saints. It is a holyday of obligation. Morning mass will be as usual at Immaculate Conception. However a second mass will be at 6pm at St Charles. Being a major solemnity the fasting and abstinence that is

customary on our Fridays is put aside. Sausages instead of Dover sole? Some choice! FIRST FRIDAY VISITS I hope to make my customary visits on All Saints Day, 1st Nov.
