

PARISH NOTES

THIS SUNDAY our diocese in honouring St Hugh of Lincoln, the secondary patron of our diocese. I'm sure you know who is the principle patron—or should that be 'matron'? St Hugh was an outstanding Bishop, who did much to resist bigotry and the persecution of Jewry in that city. **POPE FRANCIS** has declared Sunday 17 November 2024 to be the eighth **World Day of the Poor**, with the theme of "The prayer of the poor rises up to God."

THE GOSPEL The Good Shepherd needed to be on the alert to save the sheep from hurting themselves. So Jesus as the good shepherd is kept well occupied by our foibles, our stubbornness, our mistakes and our fears. It is questionable whether in real life a shepherd should lay down his life for his sheep: what would happen to the remainder of the flock? But it is an expression of his whole-hearted devotion to the sheep, and an assimilation to the case of Jesus.

SPECIAL SECOND COLLECTION is taken this Sunday to support our hospices in or near the diocese. This commitment comes in the wake of the Catholic opposition to The Assisted Suicide bill. Please be generous!

WEEKDAY MASS-ATTENDERS should note that there will be no public parish Masses on Tuesday and Wednesday this week. There is an important meeting of clergy in Nottingham on Tuesday. On Wednesday I hope to concelebrate the 1 Iam Requiem Mass for John Eaton RIP at All Saints. SAINTS ALIVE St Hugh of Lincoln (1140 - 1200) was born near Grenoble in France and entered the Carthusian monastery of La Grande Chartreuse at the age of 25. In 1175 he was asked by King Henry II of England to become prior of a Carthusian house in England, and a decade later he was appointed bishop of Lincoln, a post which he accepted only when directly commanded to do so by the prior of La Grande Chartreuse. His diocese was the largest in England, and he spent the rest of his life in ceaseless work there. He delegated much authority. He was a friend (and critic) of successive kings, but also worked with his own hands on the extension of his cathedral. He gained a great reputation for justice, the care of the sick, and the support of the oppressed: he risked his life to help the Jewish community. He died in London on 16 November 1200 and was declared a saint in 1220, the first Carthusian to be canonized. The Dedication of the Basilicas of Saints Peter and Paul Already in the twelfth century there was being celebrated today the anniversary of the dedication of the basilicas of St Peter at the Vatican and St Paul in the Via Ostiense by Pope St Silvester and Pope St Siricius in the fourth century. More recently this commemoration has been extended to the whole Church, honouring the two greatest apostles of Christ just as the anniversary of the dedication of St Mary Major (5 August) celebrates the motherhood of the Virgin Mother of God. The Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary In unity with Eastern Christianity, and commemorating the dedication in 543 of the New Basilica of Saint Mary, built next to the Temple at Jerusalem, this feast celebrates Mary's "dedication" of herself to God from her infancy, inspired by the Holy Spirit, whose grace had filled her ever since her immaculate conception. St Cecilia Devotion to St Cecilia, in whose honour a basilica was constructed in Rome in the fifth century, has spread far and wide because of the Passion of Saint Cecilia, which holds her up as a perfect example of a Christian woman, who embraced virginity and suffered martyrdom for the love of Christ. Her association with music is also a mystery. It may be real, or it may come from the description in the Passion of Cecilia singing to God "in her heart" while the musicians were playing on her wedding day, or it may come from a linguistic confusion: where the Passion describes her being stifled to death candentibus organis, "with the pipes glowing red-hot," this could have been misread as cantantibus organis, "with the organ playing." Her patronage of church music allows us to give thanks to those who support our worship with their musical skills. God Bless you all!

MYSTIC MOMENTS Monday's funeral at St Charles was memorable for many reasons. We were celebrating the funeral rites of Lynn Langton who died aged 60. Being a lady with Downs Syndrome she had spent her life "in care". The heartfelt tributes of those who loved her and cared for her were very touching. These tributes and fond memories came at the time when much consideration is given to assisted suicide. Some of the most vociferous voices against this bill come from the disadvantaged of the human family, the disabled or handicapped. Many of Lynn's friends were in the congregation. They too would be classed as disabled. But they were certainly able to pray and to sing – in their own way, and in their own time and tune. They joined in heartily with the responses and the prayers. It was a joy for us to share cheerful memories of Lynn with them and with those who loved her. Special people! Holy people! Joyful people!
