## **PARISH NOTES**

**THIS SUNDAY The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ**, King of the Universe was instituted by Pope Pius XI in 1925, and celebrated on the final Sunday of the liturgical year. The Pope asserted that the most effective defence against the destructive forces of the age is the recognition of the kingship of Christ; and, furthermore, a feast which is celebrated every year by everyone is a far better way of deploying that defence than any number of books written by learned people. This Sunday is also declared World Youth Day. A happy coincidence is that the Holy Father has accepted a miracle wrought through the intercession of the teenager Blessed Carlo Acutis. He is to be canonised in April. Deo Gratias! **THE GOSPEL READING** In some ways this dreadful scene is part of the climax of John's Passion Narrative. Throughout the narrative John stresses the ultimate significance of the events, taking the stress off Jesus' suffering and humiliation, and laying it on his triumph. Finally Jesus will die only when he has completed his mission, and hands over his Spirit to the newly-formed Christian community of Mary and the Beloved Disciple. In this scene the Jewish authorities have denounced Jesus as claiming to be king of the Jews, not knowing how true that claim is. Jesus declares that his kingdom is no earthly kingdom, but far more powerful and meaningful. By his statement he invites Pilate to declare himself for the truth, as any judge should do. Now Pilate three times declares Jesus innocent, but at the same time makes a mockery of himself, as he stands before Truth itself, and asks what is truth. Then he seats Jesus on the Judgement Seat, robed and crowned as a king. Before this Jesus, enthroned as judge and king, the Jewish authorities deny themselves and their faith by declaring, 'We have no king but Caesar'. If God is not king, Judaism has no reason to exist. SAINTS ALIVE St Catherine of Alexandria (d. 305) Legends coming from a number of sources say that St Catherine was very outspoken at the time of the persecutions of Christians. She even protested openly to the emperor Maxentius who had her arrested, tortured on the wheel and decapitated in 305. St Catherine's courage is a great challenge to all African Christians in their struggle for justice and peace. The witness of her life and her readiness to die for the faith encourages us to be brave witnesses to the Lord and to speak out on behalf of all those who suffer. **St Andrew the Apostle** was born in Bethsaida, in Galilee, and worked as a fisherman. He may have been a disciple of St John the Baptist. He became one of the first to follow Jesus and introduced his brother, Simon Peter, to him. As one of the twelve Apostles he was widely venerated in ancient times, and became patron saint of Scotland because according to legend some of his bones were brought there and buried at the place where the town of St Andrew's now stands.
