## PARISH NOTES

**THIS SUNDAY** we celebrate the second Sunday in Advent, and are invited join John the Baptist in preparing the way of the Lord.

**PARISH FEAST DAY** This Sunday is of course December 8<sup>th</sup>. It coincides with the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of our Blessed Lady. However, because this date coincides with the celebration of the second Sunday in Advent, the Immaculate Conception celebration is delayed until Monday. However, it is also the anniversary of the consecration of our church in Charlesworth by Bishop Malcolm twenty-one years ago. That anniversary is further postponed until Tuesday. What strange things happened within the Catholic calendar! Therefore, on Tuesday Mass will be celebrated at 9:30 in that church. SECOND COLLECTION There is a second collection for the 'Poor Parishes Fund'. THE GOSPEL In today's reading, we hear the voice of John the Baptist crying out in the wilderness. He is called, and calls us, to come home—home to gather around our Christian family, where we will soon celebrate the arrival of Christ at the crib. Yet, before we reach that moment, we must continue on our Advent journey. These final two weeks invite us to prepare ourselves, step by step, to draw closer to the light of Christ, soon to enter our world. SAINTS ALIVE The doctrine of the Immaculate Conception is the doctrine that the Virgin Mary was conceived in her mother Anna's womb without original sin, that twist in our nature that makes our will tend not to follow what it knows to be right. It was this grace that enabled Mary to give a true and considered "Yes" to the request, conveyed by the Angel Gabriel, that she should consent to be the mother of the incarnate God. The doctrine of the Immaculate Conception was almost universally believed over the centuries but was only formally defined as a doctrine of the Church by Pope Pius IX in 1854. St Lucy was martyred in Syracuse, probably during the persecution of Diocletian (which started in 303). Devotion to her spread rapidly across practically the whole Church and her name is included in the Roman Canon of the Mass. St John of the Cross is known for his writings. He was mentored by and corresponded with the older Carmelite nun Teresa of Ávila. Both his poetry and his studies on the development of the soul, particularly his Noche Obscura, are considered the summit of mystical Christian literature and among the greatest works of all Spanish literature. He was canonized by Pope Benedict XIII in 1726. In 1926, he was declared a Doctor of the Church by Pope Pius XI, and is also known as the "mystical doctor".

**BUSIER WEEK** no surprise that this second week of Advent is a bit more crowded than some other weeks. On Tuesday in the early afternoon at St Charles school there will be a penitential service and confessions for the schoolchildren. JUBILEE YEAR 2025 The year 2024 is designated the year of prayer ahead of next year's Jubilee Year of Hope. Jubilee is an extraordinary event in the life of the universal church. We will hear much more about it as we draw to the end of the year. Pope Francis will push open the Holy Door at Peter's basilica on Christmas Eve, officially to open that year of Jubilee, ending in January 2026. Bishop Patrick will designate the holy door of St Barnabas cathedral in Nottingham on the 29th of December. A prayer has been prepared for use throughout the church during the jubilee year, copies of this prayer are now published and freely available from the back of church. Please take one home for your own use, or to pass on to a friend or family. Above all please try to remember to pray the prayer daily during the jubilee year. More details of the jubilee are found lavishly on the Internet and we will do our best to highlight the main events as they occur. **USED STAMPS** Used stamps are being collected in supported Reuben's Retreat, a local charity. Doubtless many people are receiving Christmas messages by post these days. Please remember to keep those used stamps and bring them to church and we will make sure they reach their proper destination.
