PARISH NOTES

TODAY "WORLD COMMUNICATIONS" SUNDAY This may seem a rather remote topic. However, the message of the late Pope Francis for this Sunday is powerful and inspiring reading. That message is echoed by Pope Leo in a recent address to media specialists: 'Dear friends, we will get to know each other better over time. We have experienced – we can say together – truly special days. We have shared them through every form of media: TV, radio, internet, and social media. I sincerely hope that each of us can say that these days unveiled a little bit of the mystery of our humanity and left us with a desire for love and peace. For this reason, I repeat to you today the invitation made by Pope Francis in his message for this year's World Day of Social Communications: let us disarm communication of all prejudice and resentment, fanaticism and even hatred; let us free it from aggression. We do not need loud, forceful communication, but rather communication that is capable of listening and of gathering the voices of the weak who have no voice. Let us disarm words and we will help to disarm the world. Disarmed and disarming communication allows us to share a different view of the world and to act in a manner consistent with our human dignity.'

There is a second collection today.

THIS SUNDAY we journey (unbelievably!) into June. In the devotional calendar of the church, this is the month of the Sacred Heart.

THE GOSPEL In this final part of the high priestly prayer of Jesus, he suddenly turns from concern for the circle of his disciples to concern for the wider circle of future disciples, and prays for their unity. The unity of the disciples was to be a sign not only horizontally, a sign of their love for one another, but also vertically, a sign of the love of Jesus for them and the mutual love of Jesus and the Father. It was to be a sign for the world, 'that the world may believe that you sent me'. There is a story that in extreme old age the Apostle John would be carried into the Christian assembly and asked to give them a saving message. All he would say was, 'Love one another'. And at the early martyrdoms the spectators would say, 'See how these Christian love one another!' Already the Letter of John, especially 2 and 3 John, show that Christian unity was not flawless. The scandals of Christian disunity have become flagrant since the break between Eastern and Western Christianity in 1054 and the shattering of Western Christianity into increasingly petty fragments since 1517. Mission to non-Christians has in the last century or so shown the counterproductive absurdity of this disunity, but the priority given by the Churches to this sign of Jesus' message remains far below that of their Founder. A scatter of quarrelling sects is hardly an effective sign of divine love.
